St. Bridget Family in Christ, over the past 15 weeks this Faith Formation Statement has focused on Jesus’ revelation to St. Faustina as written in Sister’s diary. You might be asking why? It appears from all that can be seen, that our world is in a transitional stage regarding its values. As Christians, we are blessed to have relevant guiding principles from Jesus, as revealed to St. Faustina, “My Heart over flows with great mercy for souls, and especially for poor sinners... For them I dwell in the tabernacle as King of Mercy. Jesus, I trust in you. “The two rays denote Blood and Water; the pale ray stands for the blood that makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the blood which is the life of souls...By means of this image I (Jesus Christ) shall grant many graces to souls.” Divine Mercy is the out pouring of God’s love.
