### **Update on Father Haydock:**

Father Haydock continues to recover after his fall last weekend. He is improving but will be going into rehabilitation. He knows we are all praying for his speedy recovery and has asked that we limit his personal visits until he settles into his rehabilitation.

### *Funeral Guidelines:*

When someone dies in your family and you wish a service at the church, please contact Fr. Haydock to decide on a day and time. Generally, Saturday is not a good day for a funeral in the parish. It is difficult to get volunteers to help on Saturday. Cemeteries usually charge more for a Saturday burial. You will meet with Fr. Haydock to plan out the funeral. You will choose readings and music. You must use parish musicians; others are welcome to join them. Music must be in conformity to church guidelines. If you wish family members to participate, we will discuss the parts that they will have. You may have a rosary the night before or a vigil service, which is comprised of readings and reflections. The service can be held in the church if you have a large crowd. If you have a very small crowd, you may wish to have the rosary at the funeral home.

You are welcome to have a eulogy. The time allotted is ten minutes which can be divided between a number of speakers. However, you need to submit a copy of the eulogy before the service. Eulogies can come before the mass or after the gospel or after communion. Father Haydock will let you know before the service begins. For his part, Father Haydock will reflect on the readings and the role of the person in the parish.

The parish is happy to provide a reception after the funeral if you wish. Please contact Luanne Johnson for more information.
