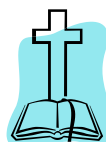

The Winter Shelter

Help the homeless of North Seattle.

Our Lady of the Lake is hosting an emergency overnight shelter again this year, in conjunction with "Lake City Partners Ending Homelessness". As part of this effort, St. Bridget's has agreed to provide volunteers for the final week of the month, Feb. 22-27, 2018.

MAKE A MEAL—We'll be providing both dinner and breakfast for approximately 30 people. Consider doing this as a family Lenten Activity, or with fellow parishioners.

ACT AS "HOST" - We'll need two parishioners to be on site to assist the Lake City staffers who will also be present. Your duties include serving and cleaning up after the meal, light housekeeping, and generally providing a welcoming presence to those we serve. You can sign up for either the:

Evening shift—7-11:00pm

or the **Morning shift 5-7:30am**

Note that hosts will need to be compliant with the "Safe Environment" requirements of the Archdiocese. A class will be offered on Jan 25th and again on Jan. 30th (6pm at OLL). Hosts should also plan on attending on the Host orientation meetings offered on either Jan 25th or Jan 30th (at 8:15 pm) in the shelter space (the Parish Center located across from the church, 3517 NE 89th). Note that these orientations follow the Safe Environment classes offered on both of these evenings.

Miscellaneous: We need a volunteer to take the shelter blankets to the Laundromat once during our week. Also needed is a phone volunteer.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity—2018

"Your Right Hand, O Lord, Glorious in Power" (Ex 15:6)

The week of Prayer for Christian Unity is celebrated from Jan.18-25th each year. The theme for the week in 2018, "Your right hand, O Lord, glorious in power," is inspired by Exodus 15:6. The resources for the week have been prepared by members of different churches in the Caribbean.

Christians are reminded of Jesus' prayer for disciples that "they may one so that the world may believe (John 17:21)." At this time, we come together as an ecumenical community, brothers and sisters in Christ, for prayer and worship, reflection and action, in all manner of ways—small and large—to both reflect and deepen our unity in Christ and to extend our partnerships with one another, guided by the Holy Spirit. As people of God, we recognize that our call to fellowship and communion, healing and liberation, is not a one-a-year event but a perennial invitation and challenge.

For this upcoming Week of Prayer, the Church Council of Greater Seattle invites congregations, faith groups, families and individuals to partake of the opportunity to pray during local worship times and at home. The materials for group liturgy and for prayers during the week can be found on the World Council of Churches' [website](#). We highlight certain aspects of the theme of the week for your own adaption for a prayer service/reflection time or for incorporation into broader worship. We will also share reflections of various faith members during the Week of Prayer. As such a times as this, the call to prayer is extraordinary and urgent: putting on the mind of Christ, we believe that God hears our prayers and is inspiring us to become "new creations" and to be generative agents of transformation. We invite your participation as you deem appropriate and we look forward to hearing of your experience.
